



NFL FLAG Insurance Overview

To assist us with the Insurance Process for NFL FLAG, please follow this simple plan outlined below.

1. Your organization must sign the NFL FLAG League Terms and Conditions form and must have an insurance policy covering its activities with limits of at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000). Your organization is responsible for contacting its insurer to determine whether this requirement can be met and for providing NFL Properties LLC (or the National Football League) with the appropriate certificate(s) of insurance.
2. Your organization must name the following organizations as additional insureds: NFL Properties LLC, NFL Ventures, L.P., the National Football League and its member professional football clubs, and each of their respective officers, directors, shareholders, employees, sponsors and agents. Please note that the address that needs to go under the “Certificate Holder” section on your Certificate of Insurance is as follows:

3. Be sure to request that your insurance carrier issuing the Certificate of Insurance lists the name of your NFL FLAG league (as it appears on your Terms and Conditions form and other registration documents) under the “Insured” section, so no confusion exists regarding which league this certificate covers.

When your NFL FLAG league has a different address, business or attention name than that which is indicated in the "Insured" box, please request that your insurance carrier issuing the Certificate of Insurance list the correct NFL FLAG league name and address in the “Description of Operations/Locations/Vehicles/Special Items” box.

For Self-Insured Municipalities and Other Governmental Organizations:

Instead of providing a certificate of insurance, all self-insured municipalities and governmental organizations are required to provide NFL Properties LLC with a letter stating they are self-insured prior to the beginning of their NFL FLAG league’s play.
